
Pretty Gritty Tacoma Lectures: The Blackwell Family

Meet Doris Renna

Doris was born on July 4th in Pathfork, Kentucky—a small mining town. She jokes that the one doctor in town was so drunk when he came to deliver her, he passed out on the couch before she was born and her birth was not recorded! Her family moved to this area when she was young to be close to family, and she has been here ever since.

Many years ago, probably in the 40's, when Doris was a poor little girl from way on the other side of town, Franke Tobey Jones was something to be revered because it was special, kind of like the Weyerhaeuser mansion.

Many years later, she lived in the complex next door to Solstice. This was way back in 2002, and she was looking for some place to take an exercise class since she had exercised most of her life. She asked a friend who told her about the FTJ Wellness Center, so she checked it out and joined. (That was the old Wellness Center, not the big one we have today.) She invited her neighbor to join her because her neighbor had been asking, "Where do you go for all these morning exercise classes?" That was just how it kind of started, and whoever else became her neighbor started exercising with her.

When the (new) Wellness Center was first built in 2004, FTJ wanted to keep it open on weekends, but there was a concern that people might fall or hurt themselves, so FTJ hired Doris to come and just watch to make sure nothing happened. She eventually started helping out at the Point Ruston Senior Center. At first, she would occasionally fill in for someone else on vacation, but when that person retired about six years ago, Doris has been there ever since. She continues to go there three mornings a week and lead exercises that she's created. She says "That's my therapy!" She leads strength and balance exercises with weights and straps, with an average of 26 people participating. "It's not a big space and there's not a lot of room to stretch," comments Doris, "so it's kind of a trick to find enough room for everybody. But the participants love it and we have almost a party atmosphere."

As you can see, Doris has been acquainted with FTJ for many years. She'd been in her own home for over 30 years, but the house and the yard just became a lot to take care of. She checked many other places, but FTJ felt more like home, so in 2022 she moved into the Tobey Jones building. "Any kind of change is difficult, and it did take some adjusting, "Doris says, "but now I'm very comfortable here at FTJ."



Centennial Circle

100 Years of Philanthropy—Expanding the Circle

In 1923, Mrs. Franke Tobey Jones donated \$150,000 and four acres of land where a rest-home could be built for persons over the age of 65 to live out the "sunset of their lives."

With the help of the Philanthropic Education Organization (PEO), and other philanthropic committees known as "Circles," the money was raised to not only build, but maintain one of the first retirement communities in the United States. One hundred years later, FTJ continues to honor the mission "to enrich and extend the quality of life for seniors in our community."

To perpetuate the legacy of Mrs. Franke Tobey Jones and strengthen the FTJ Charitable Subsidy Fund, Philanthropy has inviting community members, residents, families, and staff to be part of the 2024 Centennial Circle. Anyone who makes a gift of \$100 or more will become a Centennial Circle Member. All gifts will benefit Charitable Subsidy and contributors will be acknowledged in the FTJ Centennial Time Capsule and as a Centennial Circle Member in the 2024 Annual Report.

In this milestone year, we are very pleased to announce that with a generous bequest from the estate of Mrs. Marilyn Dimmer, a former FTJ Board Member, the Centennial Circle received an initial gift of \$100,000, and with other gifts has grown to \$150,000, the same amount that Mrs. Franke Tobey Jones gave to start this amazing community.
